





# Literacy



**Enrolment ratio increased**  
from **77%** in 1999  
to **86%** in 2010


**The gross secondary enrollment rate Increased**  
from **59%** in 1999  
to **69%** by 2010

**50 million** adults are illiterate in the region,  
more than two-thirds of whom are women.

**One in five** young people in the Arab States have never completed primary school.

Between 1980 and 2000, on average, MENA countries spent **5%** of their GDP on education—higher than any other developing region.

# Poverty. 2010

- 5% of the MENA population are below the lowest \$1.25-a-day poverty line and suffer from many forms of deprivation, including malnutrition.
- As many as 17% of Egyptians, 15% of Yemenis and 10% of Moroccans have consumption levels which are no more than 50 cents per day above \$2 a day.
- 17% of the MENA region below \$2-a-day in 2005.


